QUARÀS | VINEYARD

Quaràs is the name of the French captain who led Napoleon's troops in the assault on the castle of Segonzano (November 1796). The vineyard of the typical white Burgundian grape variety: Chardonnay, is dedicated to him. Located on the slopes of Monte Avvoltoio (Faver, Altavalle, 1,362 m asl) the Quaràs vineyard differs from other neighbouring vineyards due to the nature of its climate: well sheltered from strong north and south winds, it benefits from delicate valley and mountain breezes.

QUARÀS | WINE

Temperature swings and deep, fertile soils, well endowed with clay, characterise this austere Chardonnay. Aromas of yellow fruit, pineapple and orange peel blend harmoniously with the sweet aroma of caramel, toffee and hazelnut. A fresh acidity underlines its Alpine origin.

QUARÀS | VINIFICATION

Manual harvesting in the third ten days of September, destemming, soft pressing, static decantation of the must, fermentation at a controlled temperature in stainless steel tanks, lees aging for about 8 months in 228-litre French oak first, second and third passage "pièces", bottle-ageing for about 6 months before selling.
